Carsington TT, 9-10 April 2022

We shall be returning to Carsington Water in the beautiful White Peak district of Derbyshire our first TT event of the season over the weekend of 9-10 April, where we shall be sailing alongside club fleets - cruisers on Saturday and dinghies on Sunday.

Entries

where you will find the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions. To enter and book a campervan pitch (sorry no caravans allowed) you will need to log in, if you already have registered an account with Carsington in the past, or set up a new account. Entry costs £30. The usual £5 Class Association levy will be collected on the day.

Racing

There will be 5 races, 2 on Saturday at 1.30 and 3 on Sunday starting at 10.30. One discard will apply if all 5 races are sailed. There will be a briefing on the Saturday at 12.00 on the Terrace. Catapults will have a separate start in the sequence. We will come off the water after the first race on Sunday afternoon.

Directions

The Club is situated on the west side of Carsington Water; its postcode is DE6 1SU. The easiest approach is from the B5035 Wirksworth-Ashbourne road taking the turning signed for the Carsington Water Visitor Centre a few metres west of the Knockerdown Inn.

Arrival

The club gates will be open 9.00 to 18.00 on the Friday (and the weekend), so it will be possible to drop off and/or assemble your boat between those hours.

SPECIAL NOTE: All boats should be washed down prior to arrival to prevent contamination with killer shrimp or other non-native species.
